Allocutio – The Righteousness of God (Romans3:21-30) By Fr. Joseph Dass

For the last 4 days, our first reading at Mass has been from St. Paul's letter to the Romans. Throughout his letter, St. Paul uses two words frequently: LAW and FAITH. It is important that we understand those two words as St. Paul intended.

First, the Law – refers to the Law of Moses; It is also called the Torah. St. Paul insisted to the ancient Jews, especially to the Pharisees, that simply observing the Mosaic Law does not make you holy or make you righteous or justified in the eyes of God. By "justified" St. Paul means that you are being raised to the former status of being children of God.

The second word St. Paul frequently used is Faith. We are saved by grace through faith; "it is the gift of God." (Eph 2:8-9). By faith – St Paul means much more than the intellectual acceptance of truth which God has revealed in Christ. For example: A person may believe that his wife is a wonderful person who loves him. That is a kind of faith. But if his faith in her goes no further than that, they will not have much of a life together. If he gradually came to ignore her, came home from work always late, spent less and less time with her, and allow himself to be absorbed in his work, or perhaps with other women, then his profession of faith in his wife, could be meaningless,; the relationship will soon fall apart. He will still believe in her love, but his faith is hollow and baseless. In a word, we can say he has not been faithful.

Being truly faithful to God is what St. Paul is concerned with. A person of true faith is so full of his belief in God that it becomes a driving force in his life. His entire life is absorbed by his faith in God. It colors all his thinking and determines all these actions. To put it in another way – the kind of faith St. Paul writes, cannot be separated from the love of Christ. St. Paul in I Cor 2:16 says: "We have the mind of Christ." In other words, St Paul is here saying, "I have the mind of Christ, that is, I think as Christ thinks, I will what Christ wills, I forgive as Christ forgives, and above all, I love as Christ has dearly loved us, even to the point of laying down his life on the Cross for us. Then we can truly say: "I live, no not I, Christ lives in me." Announcement
